FARM AND FIELDSIDE.

Timely Hints Useful to the Farmer and His Household. A summary of some of the results of experiments carried on for several years at the Cornell University experiment station, at Ithaca, N. Y., is as follows:

Fertilizers. The best tomato fertilizers are those which produce their effects early in the season. The intermittent application of nitrate of soda, when prolonged into August, delayed the crop as a whole, while early applications appear to produce early results.

From the auditor's report, the standing of the various parishes is as follows: Bright, \$701.90; Canterbury, \$462.21; Douglas, \$190.00; Kingsclear, \$415.48; Man's-Sutton, \$21.78; New Maryland, \$231.60; North Lake, \$230.63; Prince William, \$737.97; Queensbury, \$451.67; Southampton, \$940.36; St. Marys, \$657.59; Stanley, \$493.51.

From the auditor's report it appears that Coun. Pinder's salary is very heavily in debt, \$383.50, being almost three hundred dollars more than that of Birgit. This debt, at the rate of interest paid on debentures, viz. five per cent, means an interest debt that will be paid by the parishes, that is clear of debt.

It might be a wise policy if the other parishes should get as far back in their arrears as Southampton, or perhaps the people of that parish should send some one to the board that can manage the affairs of the parish in a more creditable manner.

Coun. Mowatt moved that the list of parish officers for Manners-Sutton be received. The council chamber being exceedingly cold an adjournment took place after the appointment of committees.

After roll call, Coun. Fisher moved that the sum of \$142 be assessed for support of poor in the parish of New Maryland. Coun. Graham reported as chairman of committee on the secretary treasurer's accounts, that all bills and vouchers were correct and that he recommended the committee had recommended that from this time all bills, the payment of which were not specially arranged for by law, should not be paid till laid before the public accounts committee.

Coun. Rowley reported from audit committee as to the correctness of the treasurer's accounts. Coun. Kingsford moved that the amendment to the effect that the bills should not be paid unless their non-payment at the time would be detrimental to the interests of the county.

Coun. Rowley presented the report of special board of valuers for Marysville and St. Marys to the effect that the property valuation in Marysville was placed at \$810,519 and St. Marys \$438,445. He then moved that the taxes be levied upon the above valuation till next general valuation be made.

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
