The Little Flower

On January 2, 1873 just forty-one years ago, a little girl was born at Alencon in France in the home of a prosperous jeweler, Mr. Martin.

Her father, Louis Joseph Stanislaus Martin, a jeweler, and her mother an attractive woman whose maiden name was Z. de Guerin, were very devout. They attended Mass each morning and knelt side by side at the altar rail.

Two days after her birth the Little Flower received the Sacrament of Baptism, in the same church in which her parents received the Sacrament of Matrimony. She was named Mary Frances Teresa. She is called the Little Flower because this is the humble way in which she refers to herself in her autobiography written as an act of obedience at the direction of Sister Mary Gonzaga, Prioress of the Carmel of Lisieux.

The name Little Flower was also given by Blessed Theophane Vanard a young priest who was martyred in China twelve years before the Little Flower was born and for whom the young Carmelite had a great devotion. One author writing of Sister Teresa says: "She called herself the Little Flower of Jesus because, she said, Our Lord had chosen her soul purely for that of the Little Flower, without any merit of her own and loaded it with His grace and favors, just as he gives beauty and fragrance to the flowers."

When the Little Flower was four years and eight months old her mother died. The child's intelligence was acute even at this tender age and her grief over the loss of her mother was great. Soon after the death of his wife Louis Martin moved with his family from Alencon to Lisieux, where the brother of the Little Flower's mother lived with his wife. The more was made that the Little Flower and her sisters might have the benefit of their mother's care. Here in Lisieux the Little Flower pursued her reading lessons under the directions of her sister Pauline, whom she called her "Little Mother." This name, "Little Mother," she gave to Sister Teresa, the second oldest sister, at the time of her mother's death.

When the Little Flower was two years old she heard people say that her "Little Mother" would be a nun and, sorely realizing what the words meant, Little Teresa said that she would be a nun, too. The thought always remained with her. Her early religious training by her loving parents and her devoted sisters was so thorough that from the time she was three years old, her autobiography tells us, "I never refused Our Lord anything."

The Little Flower began to droop when she was approaching her tenth birthday and for many days it was feared that she would never bloom again. Her father and her sisters were disconsolate. Little Teresa suffered great pain. Then one day...


