In the afternoon the school children from both schools carrying flags and laurels, and numbering about 75, marched in procession to the residence of Private Stares where he joined them and proceeded to the Orange Hall where tea was served. After tea the Rev. Hugh Facey addressed the audience referring to our hero, and at the conclusion of his address Private Stares was presented with a nice Meerscham pipe from the Ladies of the W. P. A. also a collection given him which was made up by the people in the Hall. Private Stares responded, thanking the people and gave a speech telling as much as possible of his doings, and concluded by saying that if he is called on to go back to the front again he is quite willing to do so. I am sure he deserves great credit for his pluck. Private Stares is one of the French veterans and was in the big drive of July the 1st, being lucky to escape with a wound in the ankle. I may also add that our Frank was the first male child born at Port Blandford, the first to enlist and the first to return from the front.

Later in the evening games were indulged in, and the singing of the National Anthem and hearty cheers for our returned hero brought a very enjoyable evening to a close.
