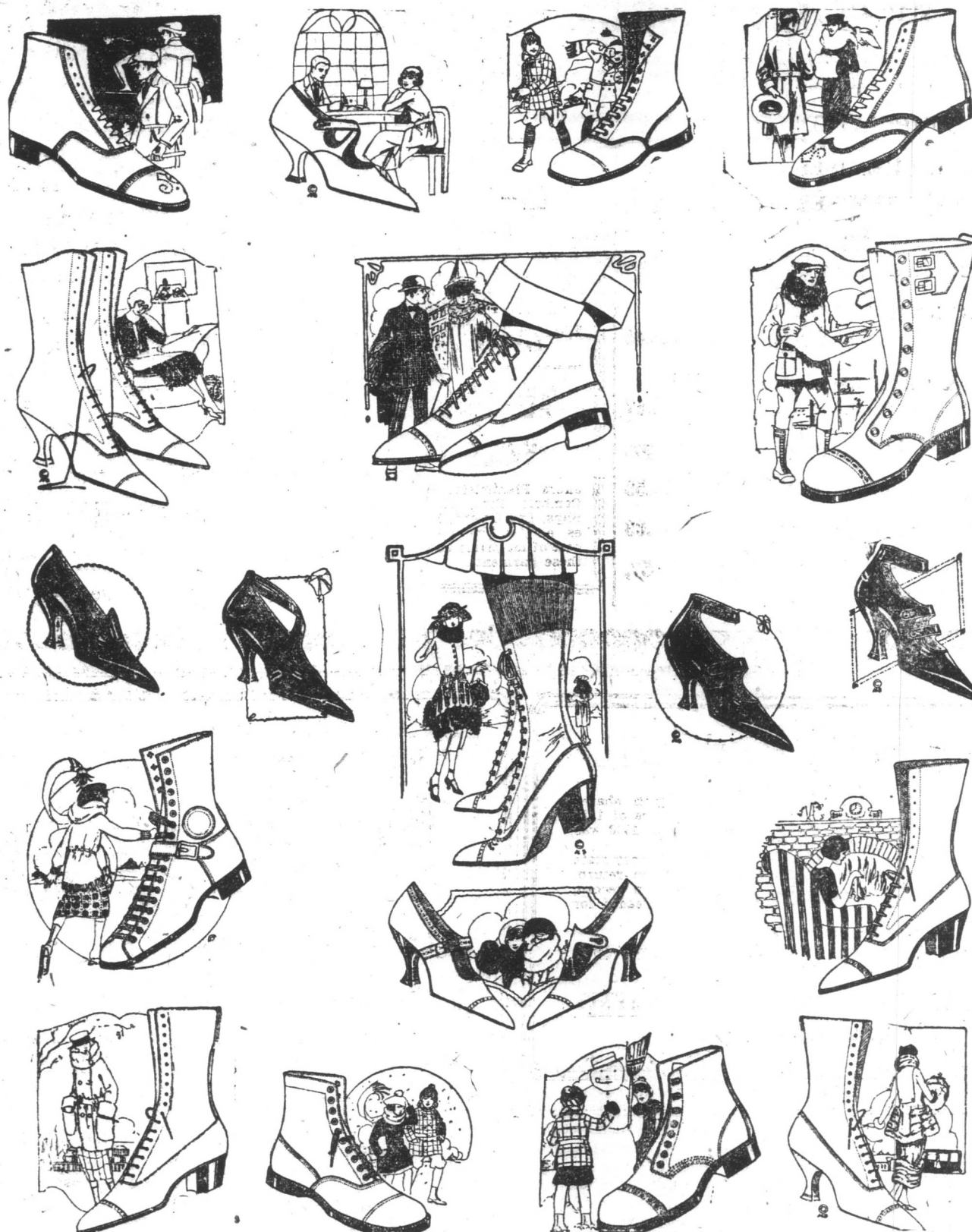
DIED.
