The Lincoln Monument Association have published a history of their past operations, from which we learn that the cash contributions for the patriotic purpose which they were organized to promote amount to \$84,000, which sum is now invested in Government bonds. The Legislature of Illinois has also appropriated \$50,600, which is not to be paid over until the money now in the hands of the Association has been exhausted The city of Springfield, Ill, has granted a free title to a site for the proposed monument in Oak Ridge Cemetery, where the remains of Abraham Lincoln now rest in a temporary vault. No plan has yet been fixed upon, the time for receiving proposals and designs extending to the 14th of April next. The estimated cost of the monument is \$200,000, and the Association therefore need about \$66,000 more.
