Ottawa. Sin, —I have the benour to acknowl-edge the reseipt of your letter of the 21st of August instant, enclosing a copy of the Royal Commission appointing Com-missioners to enquire into and report-upon this several matters stated in the resolution moved by me in the House of Commons on the 2nd day of April last, and requesting me to furnish to the Com-missioners a list of witnesses I might wish to examine, in order that they may be duly aummoned to appear, and to pro-ceed with my evidence. I have to call your attentions to the fact apparent on the face of the Commission, that it was as a member of the House of Commons, and frem my place in Parlia-ment, that I preferred these charges against Ministers of the Corown and mem-bers of that House, which on the 8th day of April last entertained the charges, de-termined to investigate them itself, and appointed a Select Committee to inquire into and report upon them; and to the further fact apparent on the journals of the House, that to the said Committee I handed a list of some of the principal witnesses whose evidence I believed could establish my charges, and I have always been ready to proceed to the proof there-of before the investigation. The deter-mination of the Commons to investigate these charges remiss unaltered, and I deem it inconsistent with my duty as a member of Parliament, and a breach of the undoubted privileges of the House, to recognize any infering or exceptional tri-bunal created to enquire into charges still prading before the House, should take any cognizance of or should assume to call on me to justify words which 1 have spoken on the floor of the Commission, issued without the special sanction of the House, should take any cognizance of or should assume to all on me to justify words which L have spoken on the floor of the Commission involves a breach of that fundamental principle of the Constitution which L have spoken on the floor of the Commons, and for which I am re-sponsibl
