### FOUND SAYINGS OF THE SAVIOR

Great Discovery Through Koptic Excavations.

BIBLICAL TEXTS

Newly-Found Passages Apparently Belong to the Gospel of St.

Thomas.

London, Nov. 16 .- Many hitherto unbeen discovered in Egypt by archaeologists who have dug up papyri, buried south of Cairo. Dr. Bernard P. Grenfell, who has been engaged in Egyptian here, yesterday, gave the following

Accompanied by Dr. Hunt, Dr. Grenfell found a rich ptolemaic necropolis at El-Hibeh. The bulk of the documents from one mound consisted of a collection of sayings of Jesus. They are all introduced with the words, "Jesus saith" and for the most part are new. The ends of the lines, ur-fortunately, are often obliterated. Ap-parently all the sayings were addressed to St. Thomas. One of the

most remarkable is: "Let not him that seeketh cease his search until he find, and when he finds he shall wonder, wondering he shall reach the kingdom, i e., the kingdom of heaven, and when he reaches the kingdom he shall have

Dr. Grenfell remarked that enormous interest would be aroused by the discoveries on account of the variations they disclosed from accepted texts. One variation of the mystical saying, recorded in St. Luke. "The kingdom of God is within you," was of great value, as the saying in the papyrus appeared in quite different surroundings from those attributed to it by the evangelist and extended far into another region.


