**FEMINISM IS A NEW POLL FACTOR**

The French Leaders of Woman's Cause Say They Won Point in Election.

Paris, May 16.—Feminism has become a recognized factor in French politics through the medium of the general election recently held. Its strength is not to be measured by the number of votes polled, because all the votes cast for women were thrown away. The law makes women ineligible to public office, and those who cast ballots for them knew that in so doing they were merely giving expression to an opinion. Nevertheless, the women candidates received more than 1,400 votes in various districts.

"We have made a good beginning and are content," Mme. Marguerite Durand said today. She was the most prominent of the women candidates for a seat in the chamber of deputies.

Says Work Will Go On. "The work will certainly be carried on with renewed vigor," she continued. "Naturally, we did not expect many votes, for we made no pretence that we could be elected even if we wished. The first time an appeal has ever been made in France for votes in woman's cause, we feel that we have won political recognition. Our progress will be rapid, as I believe it will be."

Mme. Durand received 403 votes. Hubertine Auclert, another suffragette leader, polled 590. Mme. Pelletier, a doctor, had 340 and Mme. Magnerie 150.

The elections passed off more quietly than in other years, the results strengthening the parties now in control of the government, as was expected. Latest official returns emphasize the falling off among the Bonapartists, Royalists and others of the extreme right. Revolutionary Socialists of the extreme left also failed to hold their own.

Have Eleven Parties. French politics is divided among eleven parties, of which the most part carry little significance outside the country. The Government is firmly in the hands of Republicans of the type represented by Premier Briand, who was elected by an unprecedented majority. This firmly entrenches him against the Nationalists, led by Barres, and the Socialists, who follow Juarez.

It may be safely said that Sunday's elections counted for the stability of France as a republic. The old reactionary parties seem to be slowly passing away. Rumors of plots to re-election on the first ballot. Another vote will be taken in a fortnight. It looks as if he will win.

**REPUBLICANS UNITE ON RAILWAY MEASURE**

But President Taft's Bill Contains Some Things the Senate Will Not Accept.

Washington, May 16.—Republicans of the House, uniting for the first time this session, passed the administration railroad bill yesterday. The measure went through by a vote of 200 to 126. Not a Republican strayed from the fold—a circumstance that brought a grin of satisfaction to the rugged countenance of Uncle Joe Cannon, Ten Democrats, on the other hand, deserted the Republican ranks at the critical moment.

While the bill which ended its stormy career in the House today contains some provisions that are objectionable to President Taft, administration leaders are elated over the fact that the measure is now on its way to the senate. It is one step toward the statute books, and Republicans are now generally agreed that a good railroad bill will be enacted.

The indications are that the administration measure pending in the senate will be passed by that body the last week in May. It will then go to the conference committee representing the two Houses.

There are provisions in the House bill that will not be accepted by the senate. Among the more objectionable is one authorizing the interstate commerce commission to make a physical valuation of railroad property. This proposition was rejected by the Republican national convention of 1908 by a vote of 10 to 1.

The Telegraph Section. Another section of the House bill that will meet opposition in the senate is that declaring telegraph and telephone companies to be "common carriers." Senate Republicans and the House leaders agree that if telegraph and telephone companies are brought under the interstate commerce law that they should be dealt with in a separate bill.

President Taft tonight said he was deeply gratified in view of the passage of the measure. He was especially pleased with the comfortable margin by which the commerce court feature was kept in the bill, for he regards this clause as probably the most important forward step in the proposed law.

As to the amendments and additional provisions added in the House, the President said he did not feel that this was the time to discuss them, or that he was fully enough acquainted with the changes to discuss them. Referring to the clause providing for the physical valuation of railroads, Mr. Taft pointed out that that power practically now rests with the interstate commerce commission, and the difficulty in carrying out such a plan always has been found in the enormous cost of the undertaking.
