Motion To Unite With Canada

Voted Down In Legislative Council.

RESENT CESSION PLAN

Have No Intention of Becoming Citizens of United States.

KINGSTON, Jamaica, Aug. 4.—A motion introduced in the Legislative Council today by one of the people's representatives urging confederation between the British West Indies and Canada was voted down.

During the debate reference was made to the resolution introduced in the United States Senate last February by Senator Reed of Missouri, inquiring if Great Britain would be willing to consider the cession of the West Indian possessions to the United States.

The representative declared that the people of these British colonies had no intention of becoming United States citizens, and that the proposal made by Great Britain was resented. The opinion was expressed, however, that everything should be done to foster trade with the United States.

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Refuse To Be Connected With

International Organization

Ontario Fire Fighters Believe

in a Policy of Canada For Canadians.

OTTAWA, Aug. 4.—Tom Moore, president of the Dominion Trades and Labor Congress, addressed the delegates of the second annual convention of the Provincial Federation of Ontario Fire Fighters today, with the object of explaining to them what had happened to a resolution that had been submitted to the congress at their 1920 convention at Windsor by the Toronto local union of fire fighters, asking that the Trades Congress assume the International Association of Fire Fighters' charters of association in Canada and issue charters similar to those that had previously been issued to the civil servants in the Federal Union No. 66.

The chief difficulties that exist for the Ontario fire fighters at present is the fact that many of the men in the Province of Ontario refuse to be connected with an international organization.

"Canada for the Canadians, and Canadian organizations and officials for Canadians," declared J.
