

## OPPOSE ROMAN CATHOLIC CLAIM FOR TAX SHARE

Board of Education Indorses Toronto Resolution Ten To One.

PUBLISH SALARY LIST

Grant Use of Outlying Schools For Political Meetings.

The board of education held a three-hour session Thursday which, although billed as an afternoon meeting, extended well into the evening. The first communication to come before the board was from the Toronto Board of Education in the form of a resolution regarding the efforts on behalf of the Roman Catholics of Ontario to secure an amendment to the assessment act whereby a portion of the school taxes on all corporations and public utilities in proportion to the Roman Catholic population of Ontario would be diverted to the support of Roman Catholic sectarian schools.

The Toronto board asked that emphasis be placed on the fact that the resolution was not a request for the opening of the school question by granting any of the concessions demanded. There was a lot of discussion over the matter, and the resolution was finally supported and passed by the board on motion of Trustee Clark.

"I think that the whole thing is a matter of law," stated Chairman Coleridge.

"I don't think that the matter should be passed over," was the comment of Trustee Rev. A. A. Bice.

"I happen to know that the Roman Catholics have sent out a petition in this matter to be signed by every one of them, and it will be sent to the Government," said Trustee Clark.

"They are trying to break the present law, and I move that we pass the resolution. Under the present law the Roman Catholics have more privileges here than in any other place in the world."

The resolution was passed by a vote of 19 to 1, one trustee not voting.

**Salaries Officials.**  
The request of City Clerk Baker that a list of all salaried officials of the board, their positions and positions, be sent to the city council, was granted on motion of Trustees Eggett and Smith.

The request of Meadowbrook school for a collection in the public schools to be held shortly was referred to No. 1 committee and Inspector Greer with power. The farm is being bought by popular subscription for the use of semi-invalid soldiers and sailors and is situated in the Niagara district.

The report of Inspector Albert H. Leake of Toronto on household health in the public schools showed that Aberdeen, Chesley, Riverview, Lord Roberts and Ryerson schools were all graded No. 1 in every respect, while the ventilation, pantry, lighting and lavatories in Talbot and Alexandra schools were graded No. 2. This gave the trustees some concern and will be looked into. The equipment generally was in good condition.

Mr. Leake also reported on manual training and found that Ryerson and Riverview were the only schools that could be graded No. 1.

**Grant Use of Schools.**  
S. P. Glass, Government candidate in East Middlesex in the federal election, in a letter to the board poured some hot-shot into No. 2 committee for refusing the use of outlying schools for election meetings.

Chairman Harry Hayman of No. 2 committee said that when the request came in the use of the hall was simply for organization purposes, and it was not deemed advisable by the committee to let them have it.

Trustee Rowe thought that the use of the schools, especially in the outlying sections, should be granted to all candidates for meetings. He put the matter in the form of a resolution, and it was carried; but not before there had been some adverse criticism on the part of Trustee Eggett.

Trustee Rowe also moved that the monthly check for \$21.60 be sent to Mrs. Hardin, who was a janitress at Grand Avenue School for eight or nine years. She is 91 years of age, and now unable to work. The money she receives from the board is her sole means of support. Her case will be investigated by the chairman of No. 1 and No. 2 committees.

**No Towels Available.**  
The report of Dr. Dowdham, M.O.H., showed that there were facilities for washing hands in the public schools, but no towels. This will be remedied.

Mrs. Tanner and Chairman Coleridge had a short passage when the request of temporary teachers at the collegiate for more money was read. Mrs. Tanner thought they should get more money and that the salary committee should get busy.

"One thing to be considered is whether we desire so many female teachers," said the chairman, gazing at Mrs. Tanner.

"Where will you get them then?" shot back the lady trustee with much warmth.

"We can get all we want if we pay the salaries," replied the chairman.

"Some of them are married with husbands working," said another trustee in a stage whisper. The matter was finally referred to No. 3 and the salary committee.

**To Welcome Minister.**  
Chairman Coleridge and the chairman of the standing committees were appointed to make arrangements in connection with the visit of the minister of education here on Nov. 17, when the medical school will be opened.

Trustee Mrs. Hunt wanted to know when a fire escape from Ealing would be moved to the West London school. She was told that the matter would be attended to at once.

The matter of holding the field days of the Collegiate and Technical School at the same time and place will be discussed by the two student bodies interested before the board will take any action as suggested by Mrs. Tanner. The attendance report of the Technical School for October showed that the average attendance for the day classes was 241, for commercial day classes 274, and evening and special afternoon classes, 371.

The Collegiate report showed an average attendance of 321 for the day classes and 143 for the night classes.

The athletic budget of \$350 for the boys and \$150 for the girls will be considered.

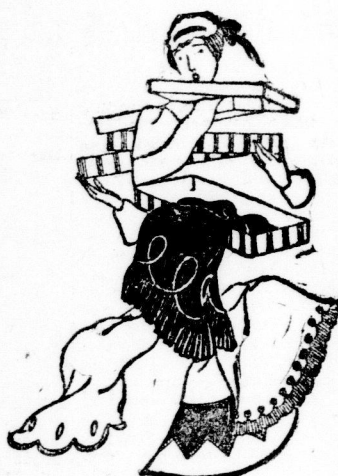
