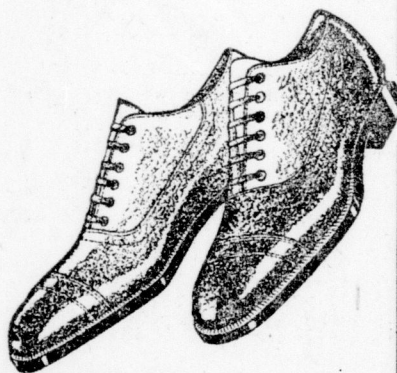

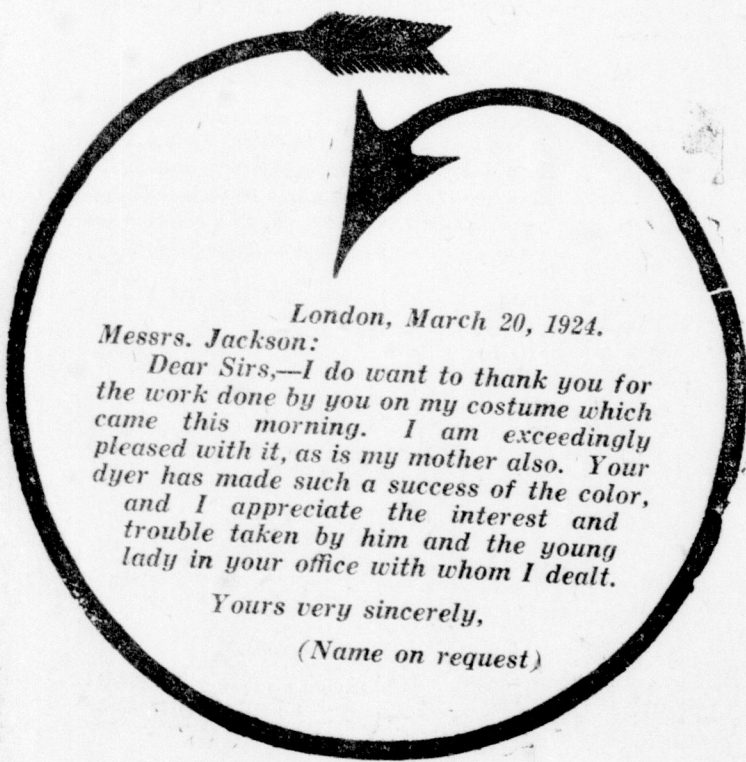

## HUGE PARADE PRECEDES CIRCUS OPENING MONDAY

Mocha Band and Patrol Will  
Herald Coming Circus in  
Parade This Evening.

TRUMPETS AND DRUMS

Great Mocha Shrine Circus Will  
Be in Full Swing Mon-  
day Night.

The mammoth Mocha Shrine Circus in all its magnificence opens Monday night at the armories.

Each night next week the wonderful work being carried on by the local shriners in aid of crippled children will be enriched by the attendance of thousands from London and Western Ontario who have planned to throng the armories. The Mocha Band and Mocha Patrol, maintaining a feature of all real circuses, will on Saturday night have a free street parade throughout the business section. The famous Mocha Band, augmented by trumpets and drums, will make their first public appearance.

"Like Other Children" has become a slogan of the shriners. With this in mind they are striving to bring brightness and sunshine in greater measure into the lives of children who otherwise would not enjoy to as full a measure the goodness that God's grace grants to the greater number.

Strengthen Bodies.

This is the work in which shriners

are asking the support of Londoners next week. They want to make crooked limbs straight, frail bodies strong, bones and muscles firm and healthy. Once entered upon a case, the only time they fail is when medical skill comes to the end of its resources, and this is not often. They take from the world a little helpless being, a burden to itself and others, and they turn out a new being. And every dollar counts.

The circus next week means life and health to a thousand youngsters who are now watching other boys enjoy themselves. It means vastly more to them than the price of admission does to a healthy, happy man or woman.

And besides, it's going to be a good show. The cream of vaudeville and circus talent is being brought in from Chicago and other big centers, and the acts which ought to crowd the building are in a distinctive class. The directors of the circus are making a change this year in their policy to the effect that the initial charge will be the only one. There will be no games of chance and nothing will be sold except the popcorn, peanuts and so on, without which no circus is complete, and which will be on sale at convenient points.

The executive committee in charge of the circus is composed of H. Hayman (chairman), V. D. Macgregor, B. Noble, Harry Morgan, Ed. Hayden, Harry Bell, J. D. Isaacs, Ed. Smith, Roselle Pococke, W. H. Abbott, and Geo. Logan.

## COMMITTEE UPSET BY RESIGNATION

Daugherty Investigators Become  
Undecided As New Angle  
Is Presented.

Washington, March 28. — The Daugherty investigation committee is undecided whether to discontinue its investigation of the department of justice, in view of Attorney-General Daugherty's resignation, or continue it in a limited scope.

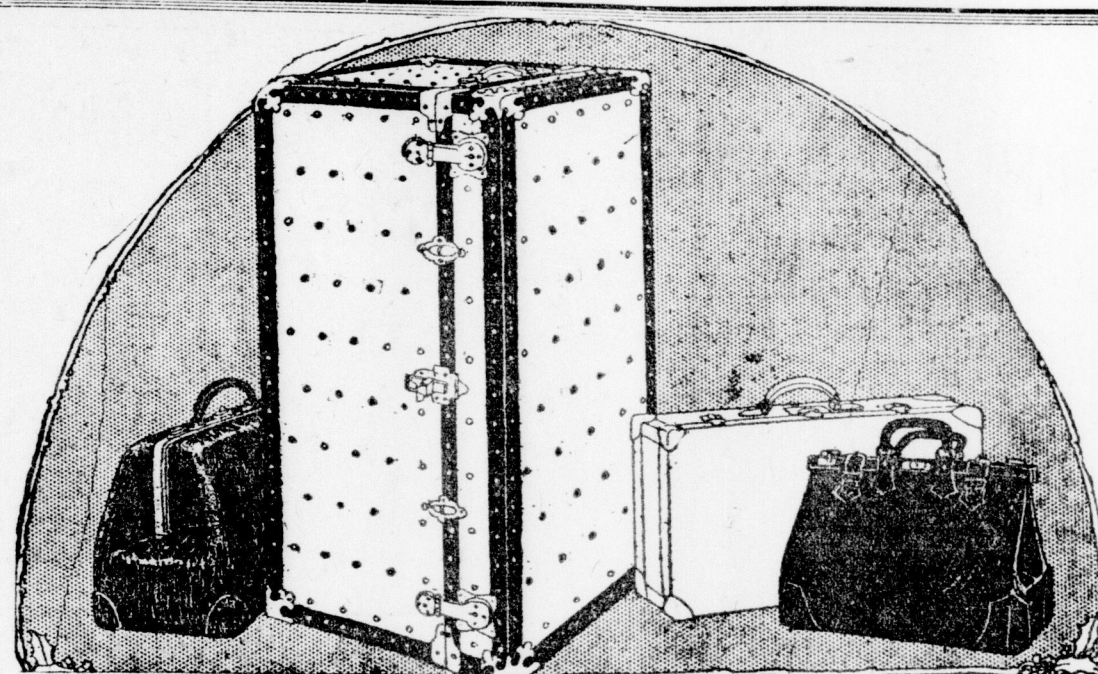
There is some sentiment in the committee for clearing up testimony already taken and closing the inquiry on the ground that its object—the removal of the attorney-general—has been accomplished. Senator Wheeler, the committee prosecutor, however, was in favor today of continuing the hearing in full, "with the object of clearing out the rottenness we believe has been disclosed around Washington." After conferences, it developed that the duration and scope of the inquiry were to be determined. The committee session tomorrow will be brief and by that time the future course probably will be decided.

## WORK STARTS TODAY ON T. AND N. O. BRANCH

Premier Ferguson Tells Chair-  
man To Proceed As Quick-  
ly As Possible.

North Bay, March 28. — Premier Ferguson was in long distance conversation with Chairman George W. Lee of the Temiskaming and Northern Ontario commission, this morning, and gave instructions that the work on the new South Lorrain branch is to be rushed with all possible speed. Mr. Lee gave orders which will start crews out on the job tomorrow morning and they will finish the survey and lay out the work. "The premier is very anxious that the work be rushed," said Mr. Lee this afternoon, in discussing the order.
