MANY GUIDES ASHORE

MANY SHIPS ASHORE IN DENSE PACIFIC FOG

British Columbia Shipping
Tied Up as Sea Is

WINNER OF 119-MILE RACEDIES SOON AFTER HIS WIFE'S DEATH

Canadian Press Despatch, Ottawa, Dec. 30. — Cyrille Crepin, the famous winner of long distance races, yesterday died at his home in Ottawa, at the age of 41, within a few hours of the death of his wife, who was one year his junior.

Crepin won a 119-mile marathon race in 1907, and was also a member of the Ottawa world champion reel team, which won its title in 1908.
