JOHN M'KANE DIED IN WEST

Well Known Resident of Newcastle

Passes Away in San Francisco

Pneumonia the Cause of Death.

The many friends of John McKane will be shocked to learn of his death which occurred at the St. Francis Hotel, San Francisco on Thursday last, as the result of an attack of pneumonia. Mr. McKane who was making a tour of the west with Mrs. McKane, contracted a severe cold while at Los Angeles, about two weeks ago and after proceeding to San Francisco, he developed pneumonia and soon passed away.

Mr. McKane had only recently been on a trip to England. He returned to Canada with Max Aitken, the famous promoter and later in company with Mrs. McKane, started on a tour of the west.

Mr. McKane who was in the 45th year of his age, was born in Dunfermline, Scotland, and came to Canada about 25 years ago. He lived for a time in Newcastle, where he was connected with the Royal Bank, and while here was married to Miss Florence Sinclair, daughter of the late Edward Sinclair, of The Bridge. Some years ago he acquired extensive mining interests in British Columbia and Nevada which proved of phenomenal value. After realizing a large fortune, he sold out his mining properties, and made a tour of the world. About four or five years ago he took over the interests of the Edward Sinclair Lumber Co. of Newcastle, and retained control till about two years ago when he sold out to his brothers-in-law, Hubert and William Sinclair, who now carry on the business.

Mr. McKane was identified with various other enterprises, and at one time owned the Telegraph and Times of St. John. He made frequent visits to St. John and was a generous contributor to the charitable institutions of that city and other places, as many on the Miramichi can testify.

A man of kindly and genial disposition he had a host of friends who will regret to hear of his death. Well educated, and an omnivorous reader, he took a keen interest in public affairs, and was a strong supporter of the Conservative party. About ten years ago he was nominated by the Conservative party in a British Columbia constituency for a seat in the Federal House, but though he put up a vigorous fight he failed to win the election. Later he was offered a nomination to contest the Scottish constituency of Sterling against Sir Henry Campbell-Bannerman, but he declined to run.

Besides his wife, who was with him at the time of his death, Mr. McKane leaves a sister at Dunfermline, Scotland. His parents are dead and he had no children. Interment took place at San Francisco.

NINETEEN-YEAR-OLD BOY TO HANG

Halifax, N. S., June 16.—John A. Telo, a nineteen year old boy, was sentenced to death at Digby to-day for the murder of Edward Macgregor, an old man, and he will be hanged July 24th. While the judge was pronouncing sentence, Telo stood in the dock chewing gum, and as he was being led back to his cell, he heaped curses on everyone connected with his trial. The evidence showed that Telo knew that old man Macgregor was in the habit of carrying five hundred dollars on his person. Telo asked Frank Calder to join him in killing Macgregor, promising to share the money. He told Calder that he would do the dirty part of the job himself. He killed the old man with an axe, and threw the body into a lane, where it was found later. The trial is the shortest on record in Nova Scotia. The evidence of 40 witnesses was taken and from the time the prisoner went in the dock till the judge pronounced sentence, only fourteen hours elapsed. The jury was out thirty minutes.
