the public-house and beershop against the church, the library and the school was but another phase of the war between heaven and hell. The Crooks Act recognizes the irrepressible conflict between these two opposing forces by enacting that proximity to a public school, church or place of public worship shall be a legitimate objection to the planting of a tavern or saloon in that particular legality. Unfortunately our License Commissioners, both past and present, seem to ignore, if not defy, this wise provision of the law which they are appointed to administer. Some years ago the commissioners, in suite of the most earnest protests from the officials of Erskine Church, not content with planting one licensed liquor bar at the yery doors of that church, located another about 50 yards off, which outrage is still maintained. Then, look at the case of James Lennox v. Knex Giurch. What else but an open defiance of this provision of the Crooks Act can the locating of this so-called hotel be, against the most strenuous opposition of the church authorities and the largest employers of labor in the immediate neighborhood? It used to be our boast that the liquor traffic was not permitted to exist near any public works, but in this case this principle, too, seems to be set at naught. I respectfully submit that the spirit and intent of the Crooks Act is that a license should only be granted where there was a clear public demand for hotel accommodation.


