The Bids By the Canadian Banks Did Not Reach the Figures of the English Capi-talists-Financial Men Discussing the Methods Pursued By the Local Au-thorities. Financial men here and in Montreal are criticising the method pursued by Toronto's municipal authorities in their efforts to dispose of the city bonds. They resent the secrecy, the frequent meet-ings, the delays. They claim that the sub-committee of aldermen first went wrong in not openly advertising for tenders for the purchase of so many 31-2 per cent. bonds.
