SOMMAIRE

With reference to the conversation which has taken place recently between your Excellency and the Canadian Ambassador to the Netherlands, and in view of the agreement reached on December 9, 1949, regarding the exchange of notes between the two Governments concerning the requirements for non-emigrant travellers of the two countries.

(2) Canadian citizens who are in possession of valid national passports may, without previously obtaining a visa, enter the Netherlands for periods not exceeding three months, provided that they are in possession of sufficient funds to cover their expenses during their stay in the Netherlands.

(3) It is understood that the modification of entrance requirements does not apply to those citizens of the Netherlands and the Netherlands who are in possession of valid national passports and who are in possession of sufficient funds to cover their expenses during their stay in the Netherlands.

If the Government of the Netherlands is prepared to accept the foregoing provisions, the Canadian Government has the honour to suggest that the present agreement be signed by the two Governments which shall take effect on the day of the signature.
