

January 1, 1996

There will be another tariff cut. This is the final deadline for Canada and the U.S. to agree on new trade remedy rules. Production-based duty waivers for production in the auto industry will end.

January 1, 1997

Another tariff reduction.

January 1, 1998

Tariffs will have ended on remaining goods:

Most agricultural products	Steel
Textiles and apparel	Appliances
Softwood plywood	Beef
Pleasure craft	Railcars
	Tires

The snapback provisions on vegetables and fresh fruits will remain for another decade.
