### Human Resources Development and Institutional Strengthening

With 13 projects and a total commitment of CDN \$171.9 million over an extended time period, the human resources development and institutional strengthening sector is the largest component of CIDA's bilateral program. Within this program area, over one third is allocated for water projects, specifically to assist Indonesian institutions responsible for water resource management. Other significant projects are in the areas of scientific capability, regional planning, personnel, and veterinary services.

### **Participatory Development**

Within this programming area are a number of projects ranging from efforts to increase the capacity of Indonesian co-operatives to better serve their members, to rural community development, to linkages between Canadian and Indonesian non-governmental organizations.

#### **Private Sector Co-operation**

Currently still in the inception stage, CIDA's intention is to encourage co-operative efforts between Canadian and Indonesian companies and in turn, to promote development in Indonesia via a healthy private sector.

# 4.2 Industrial Co-operation Program

CIDA's Industrial Co-operation program (CIDA-INC) supports private sector initiatives in developing countries. Since 1984-85, it has contributed approximately \$9.9 million to Indonesia, a large portion of which supported Canadian companies investigating investment possibilities in Indonesia. Disbursements to Indonesia for 1991-92 were approximately \$2 million. Deregulation and privatization in Indonesia since 1985 have led to a receptive local environment for CIDA-INC clients in various economic sectors, including fish farming and telecommunications. Current initiatives include support for a Canadian Investment Adviser with Indonesia's Investment Coordination Board.

# 4.3 Special Programs and Multilateral Contributions

In 1990-91, \$3.82 million was made available to Indonesia through a range of programs supported by CIDA's Non-Governmental Organizations and Institutional Co-operation Programs. A total of 7 projects and 30 sub-projects were sponsored, primarily in the areas of education, health and agriculture.
