The Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Honourable Paul Martin, today announced the appointment of Mr. Edward Henry Maguire, of the Department of Trade and Commerce, as Canadian Consul in Detroit. Mr. Maguire will succeed Mr. S. V. Allen, whose appointment as Consul-General to Chicago was announced in January.

Born in 1914, Mr. Maguire was a member of the Royal Canadian Navy during the war, being discharged with the rank of Lieutenant Commander. After joining the Trade Commissioner Service in 1945, Mr. Maguire served in Buenos Aires in 1946 and in Santiago in 1947. His subsequent appointments were as Trade Commissioner in Madrid from 1950 to 1954, Commercial Secretary in Washington from 1954 to 1956 and Consul-General and Trade Commissioner in Hamburg from 1956 to 1960, at which time he was designated Senior Trade Commissioner in Singapore. Mr. Maguire is married with two children.
