

MALCOLM NORMAN BOW

Mr. Bow, who was born in Regina, Saskatchewan, on September 30, 1918, was educated in Edmonton, at the University of Alberta, at the University of British Columbia (B.A.) and at the Academy of International Law in The Hague. During the war he served in the Canadian Army in the United Kingdom and in the Far East and was discharged in 1946 with the rank of Major. From 1946 to 1949, Mr. Bow worked for the Vancouver "Daily Province".

Mr. Bow joined the Department of External Affairs in 1949 and has served at Canadian diplomatic missions abroad in New York from 1950 to 1953, in Madrid from 1956 to 1959 and at Havana in 1961. In June 1964, he was appointed Canadian Ambassador to Czechoslovakia with concurrent accreditation to Hungary in 1965. In August 1968, he returned to Ottawa as Director of the Arms Control and Disarmament Division. He was appointed Director of Latin American Division in March 1971.

Mr. Bow is married and has four children.
