CRIMINAL CODE—PRESSURE RESPECTING BILL

## Question No. 789-Mr. Matte:

- 1. Are any organizations exerting pressure upon the government to promote adoption of the omnibus bill?
- 2. If so, what are the names of these organizations?
- 3. On which of the three points, homosexuality, divorce or abortion, are the pressures strongest?

Hon. John N. Turner (Minister of Justice):
1. No. A number of submissions have been received from various organizations expressing either support for or opposition to particular provisions of Bill C-195 which was given first reading on December 21, 1967.

2. - 2. What was the total cost of construction of Alouette II and of this amount, how much was paid to private contractors and to whom?
  - 3. What was the cost of launching Alouette II?
- 4. What was the cost of Canada's purchasing a  $3\frac{1}{2}\%$  interest in INTELSAT and since 1964 has Canada spent additional sums in this venture?
  - 5. If so, how much?
- 6. What was the cost of construction of the Canadian communications ground receiving station at Mill Village, Nova Scotia?
