CANADA MANPOWER TRAINING PROGRAM-EXTENSION OF TIME

## Question No. 1,178-Mr. Robinson:

Will the federal government consider extending the time available at basic training for Skills Development Centres so that those with less than grade VII education can receive educational assistance?

Hon. Allan J. MacEachen (Minister of Manpower and Immigration): The acceptance of workers into the Canada Manpower Training Program is not based on rigid educational entry requirements. Workers are now receiving training regardless of their basic education. In 1968-69, for example, approximately 21,500 manpower trainees had Grade VI education or less before beginning training. However, the duration of continuous training available to any one trainee is at present limited to 104 weeks of which 52 weeks may be educational upgrading.
