on the export of crude oil and certain petroleum products, to provide compensation for certain petroleum costs and to regulate the price of Canadian crude oil and natural gas in interprovincial and export trade, be now read a second time and referred to a Committee of the Whole.

And debate continuing, the debate was adjourned.

The Order being read for the consideration of the report stage of Bill C-22, An Act to amend the Canada Pension Plan, as reported (with an amendment) from the Standing Committee on Health, Welfare and Social Affairs.

On motion of Mr. Macdonald (Rosedale) for Mr. Lalonde, seconded by Mr. Drury, the Bill was concurred in at the report stage and ordered for a third reading at the next sitting of the House.
