Dear Sir,-

In order to effect the greatest possible co-operation and assistance from McGill Graduates in the effort to make the coming Campaign for funds a success, the Campaign Executive decided that it was necessary to call to Montreal, Representatives from all Branches on the continent of the McGill Graduates' Society. A number of prominent Graduates of Montreal have agreed to act as a Central Committee.

It is hoped, by securing a meeting of these outside Representatives with the Campaign Executive and the above Committee, that valuable assistance may be given to them in the matter of organizing their different districts for the purpose of obtaining subscriptions to the Campaign Fund.

With the idea of creating increased enthusiasm amongst the Graduates for their Alma Mater, it is proposed that the Principal of the University, together with a Representative of the Campaign Executive, and a Representative of the Central Committee, should visit and address meetings which would be arranged at the headquarters of the different Branch Societies. This tour will probably take place in October.

You will realize that it is very desirable indeed that the joint meeting mentioned above should be well attended and that everything possible should be done to enthuse and encourage these Representatives from outside in the difficult undertaking which they have set themselves.
