

THE SENATE OF CANADA.

BILL G.

An Act respecting the patent of The National Wood Distilling Company.

WHEREAS The National Wood Distilling Company of Preamble.  
Wilmington, in the state of North Carolina, one of  
the United States, and Harry C. Moore of Blairmore,  
in the province of Alberta, have by their petition represented  
5 that the said The National Wood Distilling Company is  
the owner and the said Harry C. Moore is the licensee of  
a certain patent issued under the seal of the Patent Office,  
namely, number one hundred and six thousand, nine hundred  
and thirty-one, for a process of destructive distillation of  
10 wood, and have prayed that it be enacted as hereinafter  
set forth, and it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said  
petition: Therefore His Majesty, by and with the advice  
and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of  
Canada, enacts as follows:—

15 **1.** Notwithstanding anything in *The Patent Act* or Extension of  
in chapter 153 of the statutes of 1914, or in the patent time for  
mentioned in the preamble, the failure to construct or manufacture.  
or manufacture in Canada the invention patented under the R.S., c. 69,  
said patent shall be deemed not to have affected the validity s. 38.  
20 of the said patent, but the time for such construction or 1914, c. 153,  
manufacture shall be deemed to have been duly extended s. 3.  
to the end of one year from the passing of this Act, and such  
extension of time shall have the same effect as if applied  
for and granted within the time prescribed by *The Patent*  
25 *Act*.

**2.** Section 3 of chapter 153 of the statutes of 1914 is Repeal.  
hereby repealed.
