Inwards Turn.— Or, on the word TURN, the left file of the right half preceptory turns to the left and the left half to the right; the leading files wheeling outward and marching to their front, remaining files following in their footsteps.

148c.—Form Preceptory.—On the word PRECEP-TORY, the leading files incline outwards and form on the right and left of the leading files.

Forward.—When the line is formed, the command FORWARD will be; ven.

149. Being in Line at the Halt to Advance (or Retire) in Echelon.

Advance in Echelon from the Right (Centre or Left), Quick March. On the word MARCH, the right (centre or left) file marches straight to the front; each of the other files marks time, and in succession march straight to the front at one pace distant from the preceding file,

Halt.—On the word HALT, each Sir Knight ren ains steady. If the marching has been properly done the Knights will be in line diagonally.

Threes, squads, sections, etc., in echelon is e ecuted in a similar manner. If more than one pace distance is desired, the number of paces will be designated.

150. Being in Line on the March to Advance in Echelon.

Advance in Echelon from the Right (Centre or Left).—On the word RIGHT (CENTRE or LEFT), the file named marches straight on; the remainder mark time, and then advance in succession at one pace distant from the preceding file until the entire line is advancing.
