that no Government could expect to be sustained, because there are a variety of things—for instance, disap pointed parties looking for a great deal from a Government, who naturally cannot have their expectations realized which cause Governments to suffer occasional defeats. We, however, stand in this position : that we have the absurance, not only that the sovereign electors enderse, from end to end of Canada, the policy of this Administration, but that they recognise that, under that wise and judicious policy, the blight that fell upon the country under the Administration of the hou, gentlemen opposite has been removed, and that the true interests of every class of the population is involved in maintaining that great policy to which this Government has committed itself, and which has proved so eminently beneficial to the people of Canada.
