## FIGHT IN NEW MEXICO.

CHICAGO, April 17.—Jack Johnson and Jim Flynn will fight 46 rounds for the world's championship at Las Vegas, N.M., on the afternoon of July 4. This announcement was made to-night by Jack Curley, promoter of the contest. Work of constructing the arena, Curley said, would begin by May 1. Both Flynn and Johnson have agreed to be on the scene a month before the fight. Curley said that Johnson already had begun light training.
