

BUTLER HAS A NEW GAME.

The Alleged Murderer of Captain Weller Says He Will Tell Things When He Gets Back to Australia.

San Francisco, Feb. 5.—Murderer Frank Butler, or Richard Ashe, as he now calls himself, has formed a plan by which he hopes to clear himself from the charge of murdering Lee Weller. He says nothing, however, as to how he will attempt to save his neck on the charge of murdering Weller, Leash and Harwood, the mining engineers, whose papers he secured and which he used in Sydney to convince the innocent prospectors that he was fully capable of finding gold in the Blue Mountains.

Butler told one of his friends yesterday that as soon as he reached Australia he could easily clear himself by turning Queen's evidence. "I was not within three miles of the shooting of Capt. Weller," said Butler, "and how can I be guilty? As soon as I get back to Australia there will be other evidence. Then I will give my side of this whole affair. I am more than anxious to get away from this country, and my attorneys to open an immediate hearing of the extradition proceedings, and I was disappointed in not being able to get back on the steamer Friday. I do not wish to be freed here by a legal technicality, for I am positive that my innocence will be established on my return."

The Australian detectives place no credence in the statements of Butler that he can establish an alibi or escape by turning Queen's evidence. They believe the scheme was decided upon to enlist the sympathy of the public. "That is Richard Ashe, a native of Ireland, who served on board my ship in 1887," said Captain Petrie of the British ship Olive Bank last night, when shown a picture of Frank Butler, the Australian murderer. "I shipper Richard Ashe in Rio de Janeiro," continued Captain Petrie, "in April, 1887. He told me that he held a certificate of competency and only ship before the mast because he wanted to get out of the place. He was a good seaman, and truthfully I can only remember of one occasion on which he gave trouble."

"Last December when we were in Newcastle, N.S.W., I ran across Ashe again. He was dressed and acted very prosperous, and when he accosted me on the street I stopped and spoke to him. In answer to my question he said he had come from Sydney to ship as mate of a vessel and he expected to get away in a few days. He went about openly in Newcastle and seemed to have plenty of friends."

Canadian Girl Died in Buffalo. Buffalo, N.Y., Feb. 5.—Miss Sarah Currie, who came from Canada about nine months ago, went into an epileptic fit this morning, and died before Dr. Davis, who was called to attend her, arrived.

Blaze in Rochester. Rochester, N.Y., Feb. 5.—A fire in the "Mirror Room" of the Hotel Artillery, on the sixth floor of Powers' Block, this morning did \$5000 damage. Several costly pictures were damaged and large mirrors cracked. The fire started from an electric light wire.
