

the Metropolitan Railway Company making a junction with the C.P.R. at North Toronto comes up at to-day's Council. As amended by the Board of Control and Committee on Works, it reads as follows:

1. The city to maintain the highway

6. This agreement to expire at the same time as the city's agreement with the Toronto Ralliway Company, or when the existing rights of the Metropolitan Company to operate on Yonge-street, whichever shall first expire.

7. This agreement to be sanctioned by legislation, provided that anything herein contained shall not invalidate or interfere with the Toronto Rallway Company agreement.
