

RENDER FIRST AID ONLY HOSPITALS DO THE REST

Japanese Methods of Treating Wounded Attended by Very Satisfactory Results.

Chefoo, Aug. 18.—Major A. L. Seaman, a specialist in military surgery, who has seen much of the Japanese hospitals, and who has been with the Manchus, or Chinese bandits, near Mukden, has arrived at Chefoo.

He gives some interesting observations on the Japanese method of treating wounded men. He says that the Japanese are giving proof of the benefits to be derived from the non-interference with wounds on the field, where they content themselves with the application of first aid bandages and antiseptics.

On the hospital returning to Japan from the front there were 2200 wounded men, and there was not a single death on board during the trip.
