It adds that "a durable military victory is impossible."



TO PARTICIPATE UNTIL WILSON GIVES THE WORD. Washington, D.C., March 15.—(By the Associated Press.)—While technically still under the direction of Marshal Foch, American troops on the Rhine will not participate in any allied advance into Germany without specific directions from President Wilson it was said today at the war department.
