

*\$3 Saves a Child.

"We have found by experience that the cost of caring for a waif child is approximately \$3 a month; that of the supplies that are required by imports about \$1 is needed, and therefore the dollar that we provide together with local support practically preserves the life of one child. It is not much of a sum—\$1 per month per child—and although the calls may be very considerable upon your people and upon ours, we still have something after we have cared for our children and our neighbor's children.

A World Problem.

"Our present problem over the forthcoming winter appears to be about 3,500,000 to 4,000,000 children. We feel that if we could find among all the nations \$4,000,000 per month, we could solve this problem. Surely it is not much for a whole world to find. It is a heavy burden for charity, but it is so appealing in its necessity that I have no doubt that charity will find it. These children are the obligation of every man and woman in the western hemisphere, for we have suffered less, but beyond this they are a charge on the heart of the entire world.
