HIGHER CRITICS' MINDS FLOAT AROUND IN CIRCLES

Rev. W. H. Hincks Calls on Methodists to Stand by Wesley and Ryerson.

The British higher critics should be recognized, he said, as both scholarly and sincere, and their writings be read with a recognition of their honesty and with no hostile sentiment towards the writers. It was in this attitude that the Methodist Ministers' Association had studied the books of Rev. George Adam Smith, the representative moder ate Presbyterian higher critic.

Prof. Smith taught the fragmentary theory-and in following the fragmentary theory some of the higher critics appeared to have lost their minds, and to-be floating around in circles. That theory was that the first five books of Moses were a compilation of the myths traditions of the earliest ages that the sixth book of the Bible, that of Deuteronomy, was written at a later period; that the story of the flood was based on a Babylonish tradition, that Joseph was a mythical personage; that the book of Isaiah was made up of two volumes at different and distant periods, and contained writings by 160

Dr. Smith was willing to accept the books of the Bible as historical, begin-ning with the books of Samuel, but Prof. Kennedy of the same school of critics, said that only part of the book of Samuel was truly historical.

It amounted to this, that the busy preacher of the gospel and the busy members of the churches had no time for these fine discriminations and it was the duty of learned higher critics to publish two Bibles, one which they would stamp as true and the other as

The higher critics while claiming t be able to detect the difference between writers of centuries ago, when put to the test, now were unable to distinguish between unsigned writings of Dr. Smith, and those of a traditional believer. The critic in every case selected Dr. Smith's paragraphs as being those of his associate editor!

A few tears ago Dr. Smith and his friends denied the existence of Abraham, now they admitted that archaeology had demonstrated that Abraham's life was historic. Inspired by the evi dence of personal Christian experience it was the duty of Canadian Methodists, with minds free from "that damnthing," personal hatred, get shoulders together for the gospel of Wesley and Ryerson.
