**N. B. Temperance Federation
Starting Temperance Cam-
paign.**

Temperance workers will meet here on Wednesday next to discuss among other things the advisability of seeking to have the Scott act put in force in St. John. The meeting will be that of the New Brunswick Temperance Federation, and there will be two sessions, afternoon at 2.30 and evening at 8 o'clock, in the temperance hall, Market building.

First meeting is to complete organization of the recently formed federation of the United Farmers of New Brunswick and the United Farmers of the County of St. John. On this matter, the proposed amendments to the present license law will be taken up.

Mr. Marshall, president of the federation, said yesterday that the situation relative to St. John was in brief that the liquor traffic in that city was carried out there at present or the movement for the Scott act will be made.

The temperance cause, he said, was in the hands of the St. John city council. New Brunswick and the federation proposed having its connections reach every portion of the province. On point of the amendments to the present law suggested to the government is made to prevent the sending of liquor into Scott act areas, that is, the prohibition of liquor to be discussed at Wednesday's meeting.

The general situation in New Brunswick and the future of the campaign into which the federation has started will be talked over. Mr. Marshall said it was likely that in the next local elections in New Brunswick the federation would be found taking a hand for temperance and moral reform. The federation is made up of representatives of the temperance societies of the province and while Wednesday's meetings will not be largely attended, Mr. Marshall said they will mean much in influence.
