#### NEW BRUNSWICK'S RECRUITS

The total number of recruits secured  
in New Brunswick during the last thir-  
teen months was 9,767. The total se-  
cured during the month of November  
was 251.

land; William A. Murray, New River, Field Am-  
bulance, William Kiley, Liverpool, Eng-  
land; Canadian Engineers, and William Bil-  
lard, St. John, No. 2 Construction Bat-  
tery.

St. John now boasts of having two  
units at full strength, the Field Am-  
bulance Train and the 9th Siege Bat-  
tery.

It is rumored that before long an-

other draft of officers for the Imperial  
army will be authorized.

#### COPPER IN DEMAND

The feature of the copper market is  
the heavy demand for all deliveries be-  
fore next July. Business has been book-  
ed for April delivery as high as 38 cents  
a pound. The best quotations are  
33 cents for the first quarter, 32 1/2  
cents for the second quarter, third quar-  
ter, 31 to 31 1/2 cents, and fourth quarter,  
30 1/2 to 31 cents.

#### EUROPE'S SUGAR NEEDS

The sugar trade is trying to guess the  
extent of Europe's actual demand on the  
Cuban and American product this year.  
The problem of sufficient ocean tonnage  
is entering into calculations. In some  
quarters doubt is expressed whether there  
will be enough hold room available for  
the transportation of as much sugar  
as was taken in the current year. If not,  
they assert, the consequent check on  
foreign consumption must have its ef-  
fect on prices here. In other quarters  
the tendency is to maintain the attitude  
which brought excellent profits in the  
last ten months—namely, that the world  
will need sugar, and will find ways to  
secure it.

#### AMERICAN CAN COMPANY

It is estimated that the American Can  
Company's shell orders as well as the  
profits from regular business in 1916  
will reach \$30 a share on the common  
stock after providing for the regular pre-  
ferred dividends and the deferred divi-  
dends on the preferred, totalling 8 1/2  
per cent. There is talk of an initial di-  
vidend on the common stock, but the  
market level does not indicate that this  
is close at hand.

#### GREAT LAKES STEAMSHIP

The Great Lakes Steamship Com-  
pany has declared a regular quarterly  
dividend of 2 per cent, and an extra of  
2 per cent, both payable Dec. 28. Di-  
rectors set aside \$300,000 as surplus in  
addition to assurance fund of like  
amount. They also voted to raise the  
contract rate on ore from 50 cents to  
\$1 a ton for navigation season of 1917.

#### NOVA SCOTIA STEEL

Lloyd's inspector visited the plant of  
the Nova Scotia Steel to look over the  
shipbuilding department. Preparations  
are being made to build two other steel  
vessels.

#### THE SPRINGHILL FIRE

(Amherst News.)  
There will be general sympathy for  
Springhill people in the trouble that has  
come to them in the fire at the North  
mine. The News latest information is  
that the fire has made such headway  
that the greater part of the mine will  
have to be abandoned, and that opera-  
tive measures for this purpose are now  
under way. The men engaged in the  
work will probably find employment at  
the West slope where there has been a  
general scarcity of men; but the shut-  
ting off of a large section of the mine  
at this time of the year, when there is  
such an urgent demand for coal, is not  
short of a calamity, and could only  
be averted if the men employed could  
not find any other place to work. Only  
a few years ago a part of the best sec-  
tion of the West slope had to be walled  
because of a fire which may still be  
underway. It adds heavy burdens to the  
company, while lessening the value of  
its property, and makes conditions un-  
settled at a time when they should be  
the least disturbed.
