CASE OFF UNTIL SEPT. 18.

The case of Franklin W. Allen of Long Island against the Atlantic Sugar Refineries, a suit for approximately \$2,000, was continued in the Circuit Court before Mr. Justice Crocket, yesterday afternoon. Mr. Allen said that he was the official reporter for the U.S. Federal Trades Commission. The commission held an investigation into the sugar industry. He said the refineries company accepted his offer to supply them with the evidence at 15 cents a page. The report amounted to some 15,000 pages. The company refused to accept the report, contending that they had only ordered a copy of the finding. Mr. Lowrey, statistical manager for the company, on the stand said that he had understood that he had ordered a summary of the case and not a complete report. The court ad.
