Liverpool, Nov. 1, 1922. — The imports for the month contain no feature of outstanding importance, being mostly moderate and about sufficient to take care of the deliverles. Compared with this time last year stocks generally are lower, and within quite reasonable proportions. The demand for softwoods showed some improvement with values firm and slightly higher in sympathy with advance in Canadian deal freight rates.


