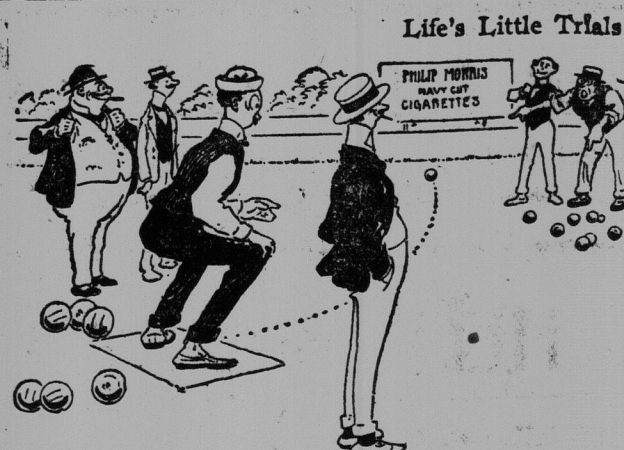

DEVELOPMENTS RE RUSSIA KEEP HOUSE SITTING

London, Aug. 12.—(By Canadian Associated Press).—The house of commons should have adjourned today until October 19, but, owing to the new Russian developments, will sit on Monday.

The commons resolved on a public statue in Westminster precincts in honor of Joseph Chamberlain.

In a discussion respecting a constitution for East Africa the colonial office administration was freely criticized, one member declaring it the most reactionary and bureaucratic of the state departments.

The house of lords yesterday passed the ministry of mines bill and read the football betting bill for the second time.

Technical Position of the Market and Available Supplies.

Pittsburgh, Aug. 5.—If the insufficiency in rail transportation were causing steel to grow scarcer for the market, steel products for prompt shipment would presumably advance, but this is not the case. With the exception of sheets, steel products for prompt shipment continue to show a declining tendency. The plate market is particularly low, prompt plates being obtainable at \$20 to \$25 a ton less than was the case four months ago. Just before the present period of transportation troubles began, from the inception of the "outlet" strike, on April 1, Structural shapes can be bought for prompt shipment at substantially the same prices as in the market a few months hence or at mill convenience.

While sheets for prompt shipment have advanced and thus constitute an exception to the general rule, the strength of the market seems to be due to the Department of the Steel Corporation has been practically out of the market as a seller for a long time, as it opened its books for second half business with manufacturing consumers.

The immense iron deposits in Minas Geraes have never been utilized for the benefit of the country because of different transportation facilities and the lack of coal. Unfortunately the state has adopted a policy of restricting the use of foreign capital by the imposition of heavy taxes on such capital, which will undoubtedly serve to keep foreign investors out of the field.

The syndicate which has the railroad improvement in hand is also erecting a large reduction works. Plant and machinery are also being introduced to develop the mines and transportation facilities in other directions. A number of vessels have been chartered to convey the iron ore to foreign markets.
