

A Challenge to Sincerity of

Pittsburgh, Aug. 5—If the insufficiency in rall transportation were causing steel to grow scarcer the market is not the case: With the exception of sheets, steel products for prompt shipment continue to show a declining tendency. The plate market is particularly easy, prompt plates being obtainable at \$20 to \$25 a ton less than was the case four months ago, just before the present period of transportation trouble began, from the inception of the "outlaw" rail strikes, on April 1. Structional shapes can be bought for prompt shipment a few months hence or at mill convenience.

While sheets for prompt shipmen have advanced and thus constitute an exception to the general rule, the strength of the market seems to be due to the technical position.
