CORN AND OATS

Chicago, March 26—Gossip that seaboard exporters were bidding here gave considerable strength today to the corm market. Offerings were readily absorbed, and it took but little buying to lift March and May deliveries to new high levels for the season. Later months showed a tendency at first to sag. Opening prices, which ranged from 3-4 cent off to 1-2 cent advance, with May \$1.48-1-4 to \$1.48 1-2, and July \$1.38 to \$1.38-8-8, were followed by a moderate general down-turn, and then a rise all around to well above yesterday's finish. Oats were under pressure of liquidation sales from seattered longs: After opening unchangeod to 7-8 cent lower, with May 66 cents to 65 3-8 cents, the market underwent a further setback before beginning fo rally.


