EXPRESS CHARGES ON FISH SHIPMENTS FROM MARITIME PROVINCES.

Ottawa, March 25.—The common committee on marine and fisheries failed to secure a quorum this morning but there was some informal discussion. W. S. Loagie thought the committee should take some action in regard to the proposed discontinuance by the government of the payment of one-third of the express charges on shipments of fish from the maritime provinces to points in Quebec and Ontario.

No action was taken and the members of the committee adjourned until the bill affecting the marketing and packing of lobsters had been referred to by the committee.
