

## SAINT JOHN THE LOGICAL CATTLE PORT

Col. H. H. Mullins Favors  
Shipping From Here for  
the British Markets

STEAMER MONTROSE  
ARRIVES SUNDAY

New Brunswick Representa-  
tive Comes Home—Settlers  
Coming from Scandinavia.

For the shipment of Canadian cattle to British markets, Colonel H. H. Mullins of Winnipeg, who arrived here yesterday on the Canadian Pacific steamer Montrose from Liverpool, said Saint John was the most feasible port. He is one of Canada's largest shippers of cattle and has just returned after a tour of England, Scotland and Ireland. He found Canadian steers doing well in the Old Country and with the market practically to themselves.

He believed Saint John was the best port for shipment from December to May, for it meant a short rail haul, and at this port were first-class facilities for handling the cattle.

Colonel Mullins made an effort to have Canadian cows landed in England under similar regulations as governed the admission of cows from Ireland.

### SEEKING SETTLERS.

F. E. Sharpe, superintendent of immigration for New Brunswick, was a passenger on the Montrose. He had been on a tour of the British Isles, Netherlands and Scandinavian countries to secure settlers for this province. He interviewed many families, and expects several to come here within the next few weeks. Some have considerable capital to invest. It was the endeavor of all Canadian officials, he said, to choose carefully the people who were to come to the Dominion.

Lady Kingsmill was also a passenger on the Montrose. She will make a brief visit in Canada. While in Saint John she was the guest of Sir Douglas and Lady Hazen.

The Montrose brought 143 cabin and 686 third-class passengers, 1,600 tons of freight, four cars of mail and a car of baggage.

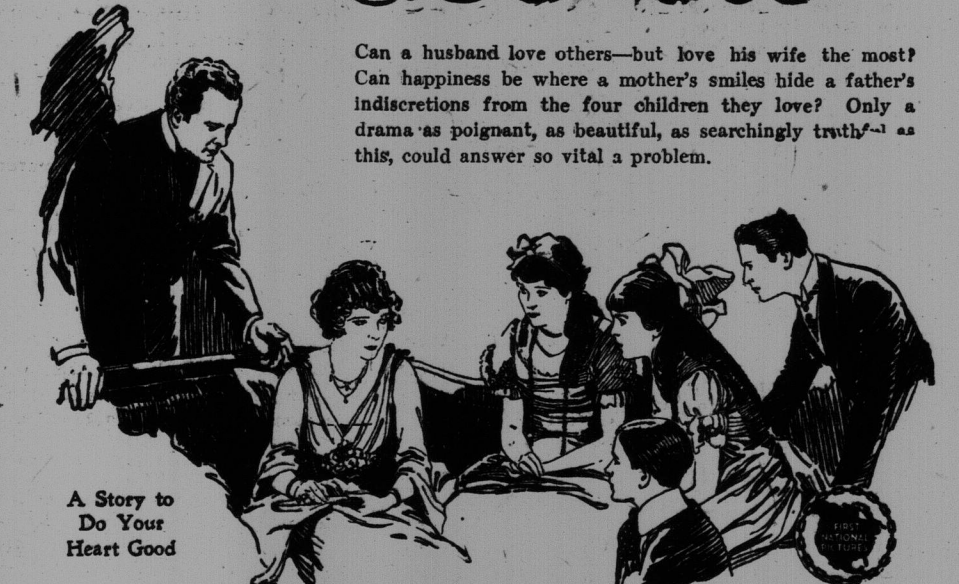

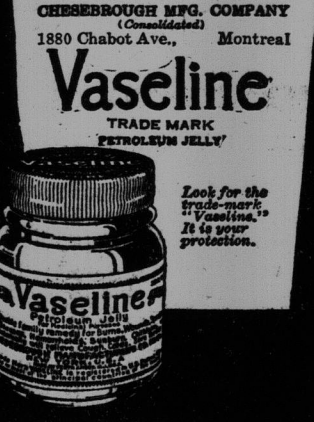
### WAS HERE YESTERDAY.

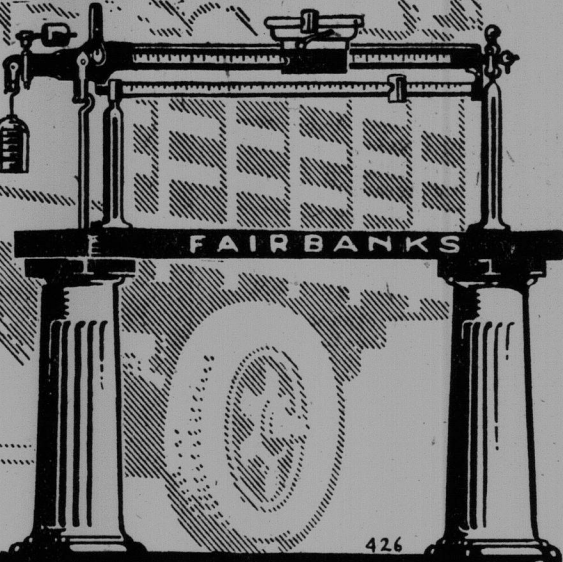

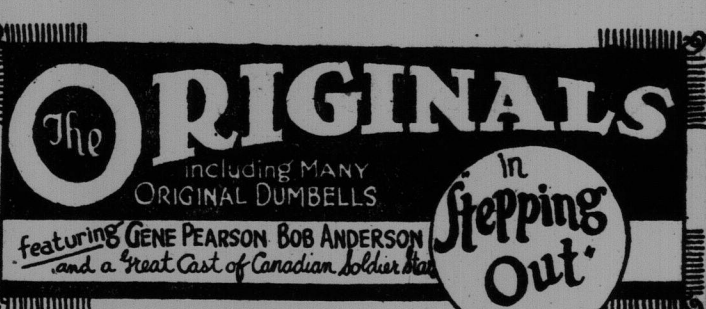
