

INSISTS WILL BARS HENRY FIELD'S SON

Counsel for Marshall Field, 3rd, Argues Only Legal Issue Was Meant—Not Specified, Says Dunne.

Chicago, May 18.—The relations of the late Henry Field, a grandson of Marshall Field, and Peggy Marsh, an actress, were the subject of much of the argument on the resumption of the trial of the action brought in behalf of Marshall Field, 3rd, for a construction of his grandfather's will.

The claim of Peggy Marsh on behalf of her son, Henry Anthony Marsh, to share of the \$100,000,000 estate of the late Marshall Field was termed ridiculous by Edward O. Brown, representing Marshall Field, 3rd. The question as to whether Mr. Field intended to include illegitimate children of any of his heirs he asserted not worthy of argument.

The question centres around the word "issue," used in one place in the Field will, and the term "legal issue," used in another place, in reference to the children of Marshall Field, 3rd, and Henry Field. In one place Mr. Field made provision for the "issue" of his sons, providing Marshall and Henry should die

before the expiration of the long term \$100,000,000 trust.

"After Henry Field and Peggy Marsh had erred they acted pretty decently on both sides," said former Governor Edward F. Dunne, counsel for Henry Anthony Marsh.

"When faced with maternity Peggy Marsh was neither a coward nor an infanticide. She bestowed upon her son all the love of a mother. Henry Field proved himself to be a man. He lavished money on his son and his mother, left nothing undone that would add to their comfort, and before marrying signed a contract to support them."

According to the contract, Henry Field was to pay Peggy Marsh during their joint lives \$10,000 a year for the support of her and the child. When the boy became five years and ten years old the sum was to be increased by \$2,500, to go toward his education. Field also took out an insurance policy for \$100,000, of which, at his death, \$20,000 would go to the mother and the child, and the remainder would be so invested as to bring an income of five per cent.

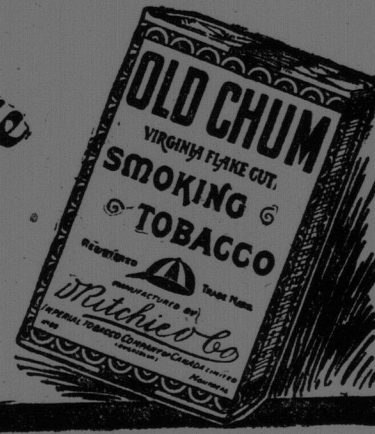
APPLICATIONS FOR PLACE IN CANADIAN AIR FORCE

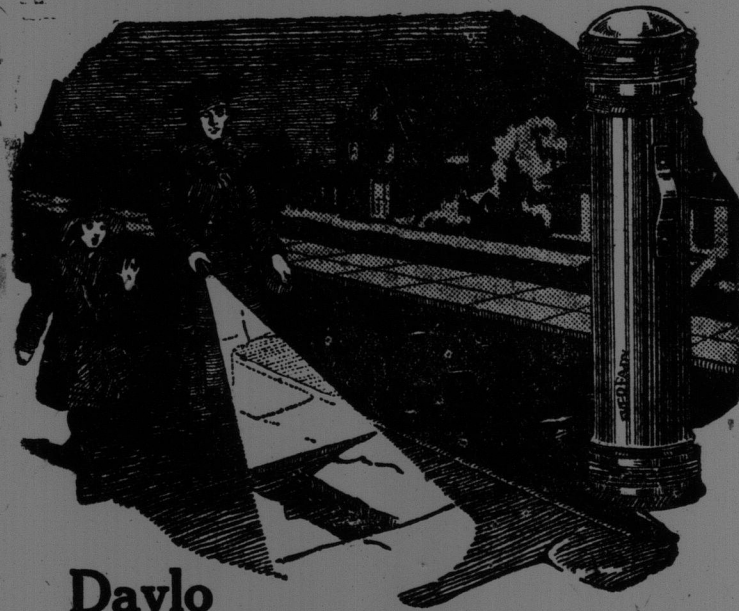
DOG MANGLES OTTAWA BOY.

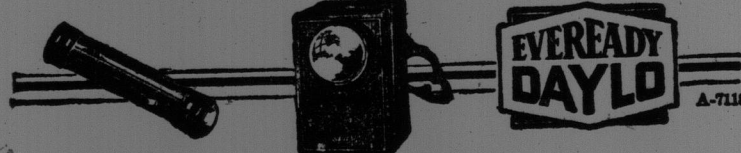
