

Latin.—Virgil, *Aeneid*, bk. VI.; Livy, bk. V., chaps. XXVI.—LV.; Horace, *Odes*, bk. III.; Cicero, *Select Letters* (Pritchard & Eernard, Clarendon Press Series).

Text Books.—Dr. William Smith's *History of Greece*. Liddell's *History of Rome*. Hadley's *Greek Grammar*. Smith's *Student's Latin Grammar*. Arnold's *Greek Prose Composition*. Smith's *Principia Latina*, Parts IV. and V.

Mathematics.—The Mathematics (Ordinary and Honour) of the First Year.

English Literature.—Bain's *Grammar*; Latham's *Hand-Book*, Prosody;—Special exercises in Grammar and Composition.

Chemistry.—The metallic Elements as in Wilson's *Elementary Chemistry*.

Third Year.

FOUR SCHOLARSHIPS.—Each of \$125 yearly.

Two of these will be given on Examinations in Science, as follows:—one in Mathematics and one in Natural Science:—

1. *Mathematics*.—Differential Calculus (Hall), Chaps. 1 to 8 inclusive, Chaps. 12 and 14. Integral Calculus (Hall, chaps. 1 to 6 inclusive). Analytic Geometry (Salmon's *Conic Sections*). Hind's *Plane and Spherical Trigonometry*. Salmon's *Modern Higher Algebra*, (first six chapters). Todhunter's *Theory of Equations*. All the pure Mathematics of Ordinary Course with remainder of Drew's *Conic Sections* and of Colenso's *Algebra* [Part I.]. With *Logic* as in Whately's *Logic*, Books II. and III.

2. *Natural Science*.—*Botany*, as in Gray's *Structural and Systematic Botany*. *Canadian Botany*, including a practical acquaintance with all the orders of *Phænogams* and *Acrogens*. *Chemistry*, as in Wilson's *Elements*. *Logic*, as in Whately's *Logic*, Books II. and III.

Two will be given on an Examination in Classics and Modern Languages, as follows:—

Classics —*Greek*.—Euripides, *Medea*; Demosthenes, the *Olynthiacs*; Xenophon, *Hellenics*, bk. I.; Herodotus, bk. VIII.; Thucydides, bk. I.

Latin.—Horace, *Satires*, bk. I., and *Epistles*, bk. I.; Virgil, *Georgics*, bk. I.; Terence, *Adelphi*; Tacitus, *Annals*, bk. I.; Cicero, *Select Letters*. [Vol. I. Teubner Series.]
