

## The Closing Exercises

The Summer Holidays Commence in Earnest To-Day—Promotion and Prize Lists.

Interesting Oratorical Contest Held at the High School Yesterday Morning.

The oratorical competition for prizes presented by Mayor Hayward, in connection with the closing exercises of the Victoria High School yesterday was undoubtedly one of the most interesting of the day, at the same time being the introduction of a contest which promises to be inaugurated to a considerable extent in the school days to come. The Mayor presided and twelve competitors were selected from the four divisions, each coming into the room singly, according to lot. The speakers were allowed five minutes each and the subject selected was "Oliver Cromwell." In consideration of the fact that all the competitors were wholly in the dark as to the subject of the contest, the subject of their oratorical efforts, all spoke exceedingly well. Those who participated were Winnifred Johnson, Gladys Campbell, Miss McInnes, Elsie Seelig, Ina Redfern, Ernest Tait, Elsie Shrapnel, Arthur Fletcher, Mary Tully, Maud Field and James Gordon. A ballot was taken and the choice fell upon Miss Tully, who was presented with a handsome Atlin nugget by Mayor Hayward.

The Minister of Education, Hon. J. D. Prentice, occupied the chair at the exercises in the afternoon, which were held in the gymnasium and after a splendid progress made by the school during the term the promotion lists were read. The prizes and rolls of honor were as follows: Medal presented by Mr. C. E. Redfern to pupil of Division II, taking highest rank in Latin and French, won by Miss Mabel Miller, of the Victoria High School, who stood only one mark lower received a second prize from the Principal. Miss Olson was awarded Miss Watson's prize as pupil of Fourth Division; Miss Tully, Superintendent Eaton's prize for proficiency in calligraphy.

In making the presentation Mr. Redfern said that he would offer a medal to the pupil who should win the highest prize in the school, and that the award of this medal would be a recognition of the patriotic sentiment was aroused by an oration on the "War in South Africa" by Miss Tully, while "Class Prophecies" by Hugo Seelig engendered considerable mirth. Among the predictions was that of the speedy creation of a new high school, which would be a great boon to the city.

The address was given by Campbell Brady in an excellent straightforward manner. The entire programme was most satisfactorily provided, including the club-swinging exercise by Miss Shrapnel, the hood drill by sixteen young ladies, the various musical numbers and the recitation by Miss Mabel Miller.

Speeches were delivered by the Minister of Education, the Bishop of Columbia, Rev. Mr. Rowe, Rev. Dr. Campbell and Trustee Drury. During the afternoon Principal Paul was presented with a handsome pocketbook by the first division, Miss Watson, a silver-plated inkstand and pen and gold pen by the calligraphic class, Mr. Pines a tablet calendar and leather and a silver penicase from the second division.

Two features of the closing exercises in South Park School yesterday were presentations made to Miss Frank (who retires this term) and to the Principals, Miss Cameron, by their respective pupils. Miss Frank's present was a chamois backed dress-brush, Miss Cameron's class presented her with a very handsome silver-backed brush and comb. Speeches at the closing programme were given by the Revs. Winchester and Sweet and by Mr. Ferguson.
