

WHAT PREACHERS GET. Archdeacon Cody of Toronte Gets t

The man who is set on making his fortune need not think of entering the ministry? said a Toronto clergyman to The Star Weekly. And a little enquiry into the facts shows that he was quite right. In the Dominion—unlike the Old Country, where (in the Anglican Church) the income of one prelate is \$75,000, and that of two others \$50,000, while a large number of other bishops and pastors receive an annual \$25,000 and overthere are no big pecuniary plums for the preacher. There are not a dosen clergymen. In the whole of Canada whose official stipends are of the amount of \$5,000 annually. The number of those whose incomes are between \$4,000 and \$5,000 a rear does not exceed a score or so, while less than forty-five get anything between three and four thousand dollars a year. That is to say that, of all the clergy of all denominations, in the whole of Canada there are considerably less than eighty who are in receipt of a stipend of three thousand dollars a year or over. There is certainly no other profession or business in the country which does not offer both immensely more numerous and also immensely richer prizes as the result of labor. And, in a day when ministers are not seldom rather unfairly criticized on the ground that their minds are too centred on mundane affairs, it is well to bear in mind the fact that at least, their calling does not afford them the opportunity of heaping up riches.

The clergyman who draws the largest salary of any in Canada is Archdeacon Cody, of St. Paul's, Toronto. His stipend has lately been raised to \$8,000 a year by a congregation which has, for long, found his ministrations markedly acceptable. It, with his great gifts—and, in particular, his faculty of clear thought and clear, speech—he had embraced the profession of the law, he would probably be making an incomes of double or treble that figure. The next highest ministerial stipend is \$5,000 and over. Two of these minister in Toronto, namely, the Rev. John McNeill, the newly-appointed pastor of Cooke's Church, who receives \$5,500

Of the twenty or so ministers who receive an income of over \$4,000 and under \$5,000 a year, some six or seven are, it is estimated, Anglicans, and eight are Presbyterian ministers. Dr. Bruce Smith, inspector of Hospitais and Charities for Ontario, gives strong endorsation to this view, "We are yearly in Canada providing comfortable homes far hundreds of children brought out from the orphanages of Great Britain, while keeping many of our native-born young Canadians housed up in our institutions."
