AN IMPORTANT CONTRACT.

An important contract for 25 locomotives has been placed by the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway with the Canadian Locomotive Company, Kingston, Ont.

These are of simple consolidation type with Schmidt super-heaters, having cylinders 25 inches in diameter by 30 inches stroke, 63 inch driving wheels, and a boiler pressure of 180 pounds. Their tractive power is to be 35,541 pounds, while their tenders will be of water bottom type with a capacity of 8,000 gallons of water and about 15 tons of coal.

A project unique even in the annals of western Canada publicity has recently been endorsed by the Board of Trade of Camroose, Alta. and if the recommendations of that body are acted upon by the town council, it should be carried into effect at no distant date. This project is to send a special car fitted up with an exhibit of farm products, and in charge of 12 townsmen and farmers to eastern points where members of the party are well known, with a view to obtaining land buyers and settlers. Liberal use would be made of literature while the travellers would naturally be well posted on all details as to farm properties in the district, as well as to the distributing facilities at Camroose. The industrial opportunities and coal developments.

It is even contemplated following up the work with a special settler's train leaving Toronto and other points on a fixed date and running straight to Camroose.

It is understood that Duncan Marshall, Minister of Agriculture for Alberta, has agreed to supply the entire exhibit for the car free of charge. Camroose is in the centre of a rich agricultural district in the Calgary-Edmonton branch of the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway.
