Grand Manan S.S. Co. Increases Capitalization—St. John Capital in New Companies.

Fredericton, Oct. 22.—According to the Royal Gazette today, the capital stock of the Grand Manan Steamboat Company, Limited, has been increased from \$50,000 to \$60,000, divided into six hundred shares of \$100 each, and the powers of the company have been increased to carry on business as general merchants and brokers in connection with the shipping industry. William Henry Harrison, barrister; George Leslie Wainford, wife of William A. Wainford, and Leah Anna Gaskin, stenographer, all of the city of St. John, have been incorporated to carry on a general lumber and pulp wood business, with head office in the city of Fredericton, N. B., and total capital stock of \$14,500. The company will operate under the name of United Lumber, Limited. These same three persons have also been authorized to carry on lumber business under the name of the Atlas Lumber, Limited, with head office at Fredericton, and total capital stock of \$24,500.

Annie Frances Coughlan, J. D. Polard, Lewis, and James J. Blodgett, all of the city of St. John, have been incorporated to carry on a shipbuilding business under the name of New Brunswick Shipbuilding Co., Ltd., with capital stock of \$250,000, and head office in the city of St. John. These same three persons have been authorized to carry on shipbuilding under the name of St. Martins Shipbuilding Company, Limited, with total capital stock of \$240,000, and head office at St. Martins, St. John County. Richard N. Tyler, barrister-at-law; Nathaniel M. DeWolfe, stenographer, and Emily A. Maxwell, stenographer, of Halifax, N. S., have been incorporated as the New System Laundry, Limited, with a capital stock of twenty-two thousand dollars, divided into four hundred and fifty shares of fifty dollars each, with head office at St. John, N. B., and with permission to hold annual meeting without the province.

NIPPON MARU GOES AGROUND IN HEAVY FOG

Bulletin—San Francisco, Calif., Oct. 22.—The liner Nippon Maru, of the Nippon Yusen Kaisha Line, went aground in a thick fog at Point Pedro, nine-and-a-half miles south of San Francisco, at 7:24 o'clock today, according to the Marine Department of the Chamber of Commerce. Two tugs have been sent from here. The Nippon Maru is bound from the far east.
