MRS. INGRAM

Jury Assesses Damages at \$865 in St. Martins Case

SEVERAL YEARS BEFORE COURTS

Will Be Again Appealed—Jury Answered Thirteen Questions Submitted—Other Matters in Circuit.

After four hours' deliberation on the case of Ingram vs. Brown, the jury last evening answered favorably to the plaintiff thirteen questions submitted them by Chief Justice Tuck, and assessed damages at \$865.

On their finding his honor directed a verdict to be entered for the plaintiff.

The case is somewhat notable on account of the length of time it has taken to get it before the court and because of its having occupied more than eight days in the trial.

Yesterday morning H. A. McKeown, K. C., closed to the jury for the plaintiff, and in the afternoon the chief justice charged, the jury retiring at 3.10 and returning at 7.15 p. m.

Following are the questions submitted to the jury, and their answers:

1. Did he who located the O'Keelcher line go west from the O'Keelcher line, or east from the O'Keelcher line?

2. Did he who located the O'Keelcher line go west from the O'Keelcher line, or east from the O'Keelcher line?

3. If the plaintiff is entitled to get only 134 acres does the west line of lot B extend as far as the O'Keelcher line, or as far as the line of the Minette line?

4. Did Power, the grantee of lot B, after he received his grant, divide it into two lots, one of which was the O'Keelcher line, and the other the Minette line?

5. If he did, has that possession come into the hands of the plaintiff and his successors in title?

6. When Minette made a survey and map of the O'Keelcher line, did he survey five to A 300 acres more than A line? Ans.—Yes.

7. Did J. H. Brown, the original grantee, receive a grant of the O'Keelcher line and set upon the acquisition and recognition? Ans.—Yes; 5; No; 2.

8. If J. H. Brown cut ship's knees and poles up to the Minette line, and if the defendant since his death cut wood there, was this to the knowledge of the plaintiff or any of his predecessors in title? Ans.—Yes; 5; No; 2.

9. Did the late Wm. Ingram and Mrs. Ingram, the present plaintiffs, have open, continuous, uninterrupted, undisputed possession of the land by the plaintiff, being the line in dispute, from the date of Ingram's deed from McQuibben being the 17th day of February, 1872, to the commencement of this suit, the 27th day of June, 1902, or for twenty years? Ans.—Yes; 5; No; 2.

10. What amount do you assess the damages? Ans.—\$865.

11. Did O'Keelcher, the surveyor, run the line from the maple tree south known as the O'Keelcher line, or from the line between lots A and B? Ans.—Yes; 5; No; 2.

12. If he did, how long since did he run it? Ans.—Sixty years.

13. If he did, did he run it, did Brown and Power, the grantees of lot A, and B, set upon and live up to that line? Ans.—Yes; 5; No; 2.

14. When H. A. McKeown took possession of lot B under the deed from Power, did he as a matter of fact take possession up to the O'Keelcher line? Ans.—Yes; 5; No; 2.

15. When William Ingram took possession of lot B under the deed from McKeown, did he as a matter of fact take possession up to the O'Keelcher line? Ans.—Yes; 5; No; 2.

The only other case to be tried at this circuit is Lyons vs. Quirk, an action for breach of contract, brought by the plaintiff for assault and battery alleged to have been committed by the defendant in the latter's saloon. The plaintiff alleges that he was under a special care for some time as a result and claims \$500 damages. Efforts have been made to reach a settlement, but it is understood that the defendant has offered \$25, and that the plaintiff is unwilling to accept, so it is probable that the case will go to trial.

The other jury cases, namely, Smith vs. Hamilton, and Murray vs. DeBruyere, have been remanded. Adams vs. the City of Saint John is pending settlement.

Williams vs. Wallace has been set down for hearing at St. John. At the close of the hearing on the 29th inst. No disposition has been made of the other nonjury cases on the docket.
